

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

On 14 April 2014, we received notification that a child's medication had not been administered correctly. The nursery promptly made arrangements to seek medical advice. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Early Years Foundation Stage welfare requirements to notify Ofsted of any significant incidents.

We carried out an unannounced inspection to look into the incident and to see whether the setting was meeting the safeguarding and welfare requirements. In particular, these include requirements that relate to safeguarding practice, safeguarding policy, general suitable people matters, training, support and skills, key person, medicine, and risk assessment. We found that an incident did happen but the provider has taken prompt and appropriate action to help ensure that such an incident does not reoccur. The manager has strengthened procedures so that medication is safely administered to children. The manager followed procedures to ensure appropriate authorities were informed, including Ofsted. The staff worked closely with parents and they were fully informed of the incident.

We are satisfied with the action taken and that the provider meets the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those

registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
