

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

On 23 March 2014, the provider notified Ofsted of an incident involving a parent in the playgroup. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Early Years Foundation Stage welfare requirements to notify Ofsted of significant events. Following the incident the provider completed a review of the incident. The review identified the mobile phone policy required amending to include parents use of mobile phones while on the premises and this information needed to be shared with parents. The inspection found that although actions had been identified they had not been implemented. Therefore, the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements relating to safeguarding policy and information for parents and carers were not met. Following our inspection, we sent the provider a notice to improve that asked them to: inform all parents that mobile phones are not to be used on the premises to ensure all children are safeguarded. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
