

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

On 1 May 2014, the provider notified us of an incident involving a child in the nursery gaining unsupervised access to the outdoor play area. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Early Years Foundation Stage welfare requirements to notify Ofsted of significant events. Following the incident when a child gained unsupervised access to a secure outdoor area for a very minimal amount of time, management undertook a full investigation into the circumstances of this event. To prevent a re-occurrence, an additional handle that is not accessible to children has been installed on each door, which means children can no longer open the doors independently.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
