

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

On 14 March 2014 the provider notified us of an incident where a child had been left unsupervised in the garden. We carried out an inspection where we looked into these concerns to see whether the provider was meeting the requirements for safeguarding practice, child supervision, training, support and skills, staff deployment and risk assessments. The inspection found that a child had been left in the garden for a few minutes unsupervised. However, the provider immediately investigated the incident and took swift action to rectify this. New risk assessments have been carried out and registers include head counts as children go outside and come back indoors. Staff taking children into new rooms to settle now record children in the daily registers, which means that staff know how many children they have in their care. The provider now meets the welfare requirements and remains registered with Ofsted

### **Publication of compliance action**

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.
