## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- She has a good range of resources and activities to promote children's learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of monitoring children's progress. She shares this with parents and other professionals to promote children's development.
- The childminder understands the need to teach children about boundaries to help children learn how to behave well.
- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of how to help children have a healthy lifestyle.
- The childminder is familiar with her local safeguarding and child protection procedures. She has a good understanding of how to keep children safe in her care.
- The childminder keeps up to date with early years developments by doing research and talking to other childminders.
- The childminder understands the need to evaluate her practice regularly to improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder was registered in 2000 and lives in Northfleet, Kent. There were no children present in the early years age range, on the day of inspection. The childminder is available to provide childcare from 7am to 6pm, each weekday.
