

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

On 26 May 2015 2014 we received a notification from the provider that a child had been able to leave the nursery premises unsupervised and access the school playground.

This means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Early Years Foundation Stage welfare requirements relation to 'suitable people'. In particular, to notify Ofsted particulars of any significant event which is likely to affect the suitability of the early years provider or any person who cares for, or who is in regular contact with children.

We carried out an unannounced visit to the provider to discuss the incident and consider the detailed information that they provided. As a result of our visit we found that the provider had taken action to ensure that children could not leave the premises through the same space. They had increased the levels of staff supervision in the area; however they had not been proactive in identifying other gaps in the same area. They were asked to address this before the nursery operated again.

The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
