## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the need to ensure her premises are safe and suitable for children's use. She understands how to provide appropriate activities and resources for children of different ages, to motivate and challenge them, and to help them make good progress.
- The childminder understands child protection issues and knows how to proceed if she has a concern that a child is at risk of harm. She remains up to date in her knowledge of requirements and legislation, and knows how to adapt her practice if needed.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents in order to support children's learning and care.
- The childminder knows how to use positive strategies to manage children's behaviour, and to develop their awareness of diversity and their respect for others.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's good health and well-being. She understands the need to promote outdoor play, healthy eating and exercise.
- The childminder undertakes professional development to update her knowledge, and understands the role of self-evaluation in improving her service and childcare skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements when minding children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector discussed record keeping, policies and procedures with the childminder.
- The inspector undertook a tour of the areas of the premises available for childminding.
