## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows the learning and development requirements. She understands how to monitor children's progress, and plan challenging and interesting activities that support their next steps in learning.
- The childminder understands how to identify child protection issues and is aware of her responsibility to report any concerns about a child's welfare to the relevant agencies.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents, other professionals and settings that children attend, in order to achieve continuity of care and learning.
- The childminder knows the importance of building warm and trusting relationships with children in order to support their emotional well-being.
- The childminder understands how to ensure children's safety in the home and on outing. She has policies and risk assessments in place to help underpin her role in keeping children safe.
- The childminder recognises the importance of evaluating her practice to help raise the quality of the provision and improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder registered in October 2012 and lives in Wellington, Somerset. She provides care on weekdays, and operates during term time, some periods of the school holidays, and before and after school. There were no children present during the time of the inspection.
