

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

On 3 March 2017 we received information from another agency raising concern about how the provider deploys staff to deal with accidents, how children are supervised and the risk assessments. We needed to investigate the concerns to see whether the provider was meeting the safeguarding and welfare requirements. In particular these requirements that state:

Providers must ensure that children are adequately supervised and decide how to deploy staff to ensure children's needs are met

Providers must respond to any accidents children have including administering first-aid when required and keeping a record

Providers must undertake risk assessments to ensure the premises are safe and secure.

We visited the provider on 12 April 2017. We found that there are suitable procedures in place to supervise children and make sure that staff are deployed effectively. There are risk assessments in place and staff respond to accidents appropriately. However, we found that the provider did not ensure that the required records are easily accessible to Ofsted. For example, records of injuries or accidents at home

We issued a notice to improve:  
ensure that the required records are available for inspection at any time

The provider has produced an action plan of how they will ensure records are available. We are satisfied with the action taken.  
The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

### **Publication of compliance action**

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
