## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The provider understands how to safeguard children. All staff know the local authority's child protection procedures and understand their role in protecting children's welfare.
- Leaders and staff understand how to provide activities to complement children's learning at school, and which cater for children of different ages, abilities and backgrounds.
- Staff know how to provide for children's good health and promote their physical development, to promote their general well-being.
- Staff know how to help children settle in, and feel emotionally and physically secure at the club, including those children who have special educational needs and/or disabilities.
- Staff know how to manage children's behaviour, including teaching them to play cooperatively and to respect other people's differences.
- Staff understand the benefits of working with parents and carers closely to help meet children's individual care needs consistently.
- Leaders know the need to regularly evaluate their service and drive improvement for children. They know the importance of keeping staff knowledge and skills up to date.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed all areas of the club available for childcare, including resources and activities indoors and outdoors.
- The inspector held discussions with leaders of the club and discussed their understanding of the early years foundation stage requirements.
- The inspector discussed with leaders and staff their understanding, knowledge and procedures for safeguarding.
- The inspector discussed and reviewed a sample of relevant documents, certificates, and policies and procedures
- The inspector discussed with leaders of the club how they evaluate their service.

Coley Park After School Club registered in 2002. It operates from Coley Park Community Centre, Reading. It offers care on Monday to Friday during term time from 3pm to 6pm. There are three members of staff who work directly with the children, two of whom hold relevant playwork or early years qualification at level 3. The manager holds a playwork qualification at level 3.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
